



### **APCRG Scoping Exercise:**

## Mapping partners, understanding the context, identifying CRG gaps

Social Networking Mapping Tool

This Social Networking Mapping Tool aims to profile civil society, key population-led organizations, and/or community-led organizations and their relationships with each other in relation to the Global Fund process at the country level. Similar to how a social media network app works, this will map out each other's relationships, the kind of relationships that operate between each stakeholder, and the timing and interval of communications.

#### **Instructions:**

- 1. The surveyor identifies a civil society, community-led, or community-based organizational partner as respondent, preferably someone who the interviewer has closely worked for the past 6 months in the context of the Global Fund. This can be done individually or in group, but the survey must be administered to the respondent by the surveyor.
- 2. All information must be provided. Incomplete forms must be returned to the respondent. If information does not apply or if the respondent does not have any information, **put N/A**.
- 3. Once the survey has been returned, confirm with the respondent the contacts in the Snowball section.
- 4. Surveyor will then reach out to the <u>collaborators and conduct a similar interview using this</u> tool.
- 5. Continue interviewing other collaborators until all collaborators have been exhausted.

#### Operational definitions:

**Civil society** – are organizations that include not only community organizations and actors but also other nongovernmental, noncommercial organizations, such as those working on public policies, processes and resource mobilization at national, regional or global levels.

**Nongovernmental organization (NGO)** – is a legally registered entity with local or national authorities for at least one (1) year and operates either at the community level or as part of a larger NGO at the national, regional and international levels.

**Community-based organization (CBO)** – is an either legally registered or non-registered organization that has arisen in response to particular needs or challenges, or organizations that serve the needs or respond to the challenges of their beneficiary community. CBOs operate at the community level.

**Community-led organization** — is an either legally registered or non-registered organization that is composed and led by people who have specific needs or challenges and have risen to the occasion to serve the needs or respond to the challenges of the community where they belong and are primarily accountable to them. This includes **key population-led organizations** who are composed of key and vulnerable populations who share experiences of stigma, criminalization, inequalities, and can represent their fellow community members. Their expertise is grounded by their lived experiences.

**Network** – is a group of more than two (2) organizations that share the same mission in response to a particular issue or challenge.
